Samuel **is going to** play tennis this afternoon.  
Samuel *va a* jugar al tenis esta tarde.



We **are going to** go bowling tonight.  
(Nosotros) *Vamos a* jugar a los bolos esta noche.

## ESTRUCTURA DE LAS 3 FORMAS

	STRUCTURE	EXAMPLES
<b>AFFIRMATIVE</b>	Sujeto + to be + going to + infinitivo	<b>I'm going to</b> visit my sister next Saturday. <i>Voy a</i> visitar a mi hermana el próximo sábado.
<b>NEGATIVE</b>	Sujeto + to be + not + going to + infinitivo	<b>Sara isn't going to</b> wear a dress at the party. <i>Sara no va a</i> llevar un vestido en la fiesta.
<b>INTERROGATIVE</b>	To be + sujeto + going to + infinitivo?	<b>Are they going to</b> paint their bedroom? <b>No, they aren't</b> (ellos/as) <i>¿Van a</i> pintar su habitación? <i>No.</i>

**NOTA: Si la oración está en forma negativa o pregunta y tiene el verbo CAN, este verbo sirve como auxiliar.**

**Ejemplo: You can not play this sport. Can he write well?**
